
FOCUS GROUP MEETING

Romania – Hungary border 19 May 2022



The Jean Monnet network « Borders in motion » (Frontem) was officially launched on 18 November 2019 and will last 3 years. Under the leadership of Sciences Po Strasbourg, the network brings together six other partners: the University of Southern Denmark, the Euro-Institute in Kehl, the Centre for Cross-Border Studies in Armagh, the Babes-Bolyai Cluj University and the Catholic University of Louvain and the University of Victoria in Canada.

As indicated by the EU, the purpose of the Jean Monnet networks is to «promote the development or foster the creation and development of consortia of international players in the area of European Union studies in order to gather information, exchange practices, build knowledge and promote the European integration process across the world.».
